October when we reflect on the Missions

The theme for Mission Sunday this year is

Day for Life

Day for Life is celebrated annually by the Catholic Church in Ireland, Scotland, England and Wales. It is a day dedicated to raising awareness of the meaning and value of human life at every stage and in every condition. This year's Day for Life will be celebrated in Ireland on Sunday 4 October and will focus on the theme: **‘Choose Life’.**

There were 6,666 abortions in the Republic of Ireland in 2019 and over two hundred thousand in Great Britain, including significant numbers from the island of Ireland. The Catholic Church, have a message of hope and a story of love; together, we can promote a culture of life.

We grieve the loss of life due to abortion. We all have a role in seeking a change of minds and hearts about the innate dignity of the child in the womb and the care of pregnant women. Pope Francis writes, *‘The gift of a new child, entrusted by the Lord to a father and a mother, begins with acceptance, continues with life-long protection and has as its final goal the joy of eternal life ...’* (Amoris Laetitia – The Joy of Love, 166).

ALONE COVID-19 Support Line for Older People

ALONE manage a national support line and additional supports for older people who have concerns or are facing difficulties relating to the outbreak of COVID-19 (Coronavirus). Professional staff are available to answer queries and give advice and reassurance where necessary. The support line is open seven days a week, 8am - 8pm, by calling 0818 222 024.

To date, the Support Line has received in excess of 33,049 calls for support from vulnerable older people all over the country who need support, advice, or sometimes just reassurance.

ALONE is a member of the National Public Health Emergency COVID-19 Subgroup for Vulnerable People and is managing a national support line for older people with concerns regarding the Coronavirus and COVID-19.
