Garment of Pain

During this Lenten season, the parish invites all parishioner to leave your pain and suffering at the Cross. The Garment of Pain is a simple way of drawing together experiences of pain and suffering of many people, in a way that enables us to support one another in prayer. Over the period of Lent, we invite you to place a piece of material—roughly 6x6—in the baskets provided in the church. The cloth represents whatever your particular pain in life happens to be. During Lent, we will remember the intentions of those who have placed their cloth in the baskets in our Masses. The pieces of cloth will be sown together to form one big patchwork quilt. During the Mass of the Last Supper on Holy Thursday, we will place the cloth on the altar to symbolically unite our suffering with the offering of Christ in the Mass. On Good Friday the cloth will be draped over the cross which is the focus of our prayer that day. During our Easter Vigil, we will place the Garment of Pain with the Paschal fire to symbolise that the light of Christ is always greater than our suffering and pain.

Prayer resources for Lent on our iPhone or iPad

In his Pastoral Letter for Lent this year, Bishop Leahy encourages us to use modern communication technology to help us to pray a little more during Lent. Bishop Leahy said "We can be grateful we live in a time when technology provides us with prayer resources on our iphones or ipads. There are meditation apps, pray-as-you-go apps, and Bible apps. For instance, the Jesuits run a prayer app called "Sacred Space" which you can access free of charge. There are music apps with favourite hymns or inspiring songs. There's a global app called Hallow that is getting huge interest, helped by having popular figures like actor Mark Whalberg and tenor Andrea Bocelli as advocates. Saint Andrew Community

The Saint Andrew Community started their mission in Scotland on 10 March 2013. Since 2019 they have been recognised by the Church, as a Public Association of the Faithful under Bishop Hugh Gilbert of Aberdeen Diocese, Scotland. There are currently 6 members: one from the Czech Republic, two Americans, and 3 Irish (all from Limerick! and two of whom are from Abbeyfeale parish,

The Saint Andrew Community has a real focus on evangelisation, especially teenagers, and also serving the poor. They have worked hard to develop youth ministry in the diocese,

teaching catechism, organising youth pilgrimages, and running weekly youth groups. As well as this, they have helped many to grow in an appreciation for, and understanding of,

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Through their prayers and work, many young people, and others, have had their faith kindled and strengthened.

The sisters ask for the support of your prayers and Sr. Kelly and Sr. Eleanor especially wish to thank those in the Parish of Abbeyfeale who have been so faithful to Daily Mass,

Adoration and praying the rosary. They say that you are a great witness of faith and the graces from your prayers are many!

This year the Trócaire Box features Ambiyo and Mahat. Ambiyo (36) and Mahat (39) are parents to eight beautiful children aged from six months to fourteen years. They have a makeshift hut, built from twigs, sticks and scraps of material in the camp for internally displaced persons near Luuq, Somalia. Ambiyo and Mahat worry every day about having enough food to feed their children and being able to provide for them in the future. Mahat says, 'I am thinking about a different future altogether. I want to be independent.' In 1973 the bishops of Ireland founded Trócaire in response to injustice and suffering in the developing world. Today Trócaire provides support to areas in greatest need around the world, empowers peoples in these areas to develop skills and abilities to cope with crises, and creates greater awareness of global issues in Ireland. Over the past fifty years, the people of Ireland have generously donated to help families like the Mahats. With your donation to the Trocaire Lenten campaign, Trócaire can continue its life-changing work and bring hope to those with whom we are privileged to work.
