Blessed John Henry Newman

John Henry Newman, (1801 - 1890) will be canonised by Pope Francis in Rome next Sunday 13th of October. J H Newman was a theologian and poet, an Anglican priest and later a Catholic priest and Cardinal, who was an important and controversial figure in the religious history of England in the 19th century. He was proclaimed venerable by Pope John Paul II in 1991. Two miracles necessary for his canonisation have been approved by the Vatican. The first concerned a man who claimed to have been cured of near-total paralysis after praying to Newman in 2001. The second, approved in November 2018, attributed to Blessed J H Newman was the healing of a pregnant woman with a life-threatening condition. Born in London in 1801, Newman converted to Catholicism in 1845 and moved to Dublin in 1854. He lectured at the Rotunda Hospital for a time. In Ireland, he was best known for his role in the founding of the Catholic University of Ireland, later UCD. In establishing a University in Dublin, he aimed to create a Catholic professional class, as well as establishing the intellectual headquarters for Catholics of the Englishspeaking world.

Ireland is a country that Newman came to know, to work for and to appreciate deeply. From 1854 to 1859, he spent great energies in assisting the country with the development of intellectual culture through higher education. He has left us with a magnificent legacy of buildings, learned institutions, writings, ideals of social culture and an example of personal excellence.
