October and World Mission Sunday is a time for the faithful of the world to show their appreciation towards the work of overseas missionaries. The generosity offered will be used to support missionary activities in over 1,100 struggling dioceses, mostly in Africa, Asia, and Latin America.

As these diocese develop and grow, so do the needs of the local people they serve. Supporting the building and growing of mission dioceses offers the people they serve safe shelter, healthcare, education and hope for a better future. This could be anything from a church or parish centre so that people can gather and celebrate their faith, to transportation for missionaries so that they can reach communities in remote areas. By listening to the needs of local people missionaries attempt to provide support in the most effective way. They offer funding to help build and repair infrastructure such as churches, convents, seminaries, community centres, clinics and dispensaries. This enables local people to build their own Christian communities – local Church for local people! Supporting impoverished diocese with the infrastructure they need to become self-sufficient Christian communities.

Because of the generosity of people like you, the Mission family has been able to provide impoverished dioceses with the spiritual and financial support they need. This gives local people the fundamental tools they need to grow and flourish. This year Mission Sunday is on Sunday 23rd of October.
