Remembering our Loved Ones

During the month of November we remember and pray for all our loved ones who have died. We remember them often, of course, but somehow with the shorter days and long dark evenings, we sense anew the absence of the loves of our lives. It is written into the very nature of life itself. The more we've loved, the more attached we've been, the more deeply we fell the loss. And it can suddenly ambush you – that aching reminder of someone's absence. A song on the radio can do it. Or a jacket in a closet. Or the discovery of a long-forgotten letter in the hand of the beloved, tucked away between the pages of a book.

When our hearts are broken, our mourning is not turned into dancing overnight. Can anything save us from becoming stuck in "the sands of sorrow"? Can anything – should anything – fill the empty space?

Theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote that 'Nothing can fill the gap when we are away from those we love, and it would be wrong to try to find anything, since leaving the gap unfilled preserves the bond between us'.

But experience tells us that as the sting of death lessens, the love that bonded us does not. No matter what happens as the years unfold, where love was once true, it will never be replaced. Part of us will forever be present to loved ones who have passed on and they will most certainly remain attentive to our wellbeing with love beyond all telling.

What's more, those who have opened themselves to life, who have taken the risk to love and have been devastated by loss, have already tasted something of death and resurrection.

For them, death will never be the dreaded unknown.

During November we pray: After the storms and struggles of life, may those who have died experience the calm of God's peace. As Mary is united with her Son, may we too, one day, be reunited with our departed family and friends.
