## Saint John Henry Newman

On this Sunday the canonisation of Blessed John Henry Newman will take place in Rome. While John Henry Newman was living in Ireland he visited Limerick twice, in 1852 and 1854, and resided for some time at William Monsell's house in Tervoe, Clarina, and at the Bishop's house then in Corbally. Monsell was an MP at the time and invited Newman to stay at his family home in Clarina. Indeed, he wrote some of his famous work, *The Idea of a University* while in Limerick and also delivered an address (itself a fine piece of literature) in St. Michael's Church, Denmark Street to raise funds for the orphanage at Mount Saint Vincent's on O'Connell Avenue in Limerick city. He visited St. Munchin's College and preached at Laurel Hill Convent. The side altar in Ballybrown church is the one at which John Henry Newman celebrated Mass while staying at Clarina. In accordance with a custom of the time of bestowing an honour on a dignitary, Bishop John Ryan nominated John Henry Newman Vicar General of the Diocese. Bishop Leahy and a representative group of people from the diocese are in Rome this weekend for the canonisation ceremony. In 2017, Mary Immaculate College, Limerick (MIC) expanded its footprint onto O'Connell Avenue, Limerick City through the redevelopment of the Mount St Vincent Convent site. It was named in honour of the 19th century priest, Cardinal and now Saint, John Henry Newman. The John Henry Newman Campus is home to the Research & Graduate School and a number of other MIC offices and services. Today we rejoice in thanksgiving for Cardinal Newman's witness to faith and his commitment to the development of University education in Ireland and throughout the world.

### Lead, Kindly Light

In 1832, whilst he was in Sicily, he fell victim to a severe fever that almost killed him. However, he slowly recovered, left Sicily, and began to sail towards his home in England. He wrote a poem during this time, "The Pillar of the Cloud", which was later turned into a hymn,

#### "Lead, Kindly Light":

Lead, kindly Light, amid the encircling gloom,  
Lead thou me on!  
The night is dark, and I am far from home,—  
Lead thou me on!  
Keep thou my feet; I do not ask to see  
The distant scene,—one step enough for me.

I was not ever thus, nor prayed that thou  
Shouldst lead me on:  
I loved to choose and see my path, but now  
Lead thou me on!  
I loved the garish days, and, spite of fears,  
Pride ruled my will: remember not past years.

So long thy power hath blessed me, sure it still  
Will lead me on;  
O'er moor and fen, o'er crag and torrent, till  
The night is gone;  
And with the morn those angel faces smile  
Which I have loved long since, and lost awhile. *Saint Henry Newman*
