'Most Important Social Justice Issue of our time'

This referendum on the right to life of the unborn child will challenge us as a society to look at our basic moral vision and to examine our attitude towards the value of every human life. Defending the right to life of the unborn child in the womb is the most important social justice issue of our time. The coming weeks will shape the kind of Ireland we live in for years to come. As a society, we proclaim our belief in equality as one of our fundamental values. So how can we reconcile that value with removing the equal right to life of the unborn child from our Constitution? Advances in science have made it clear to us for some time now that the unborn child is undeniably one of us. Unborn children are not potential human beings but are human beings with potential. We can no longer talk about the unborn child as a 'bunch of cells'. Often, before a woman even knows that she is pregnant there is a beating heart and a rapidly developing baby, a little boy or a little girl. The right to life is the first and most fundamental of all human rights, without which there can be no others. We cannot exercise any other human right if we are not allowed to exercise the right to live.

We cannot say this often enough. Without being allowed to be born, one can have no civil rights, no free speech, no right to bodily integrity. Removing this constitutional protection will result in a very inconsistent version of equality being granted to those who can make their voices heard - but denied to those who cannot. This is the first time in Irish history that a constitutional right may be taken away. At every stage of development, life is sacred. Walk to Killeenagh Holy Well

The annual walk to Killeenagh Holy Well, will take place on Sunday 27th of May. The visit to Killeenagh Well in Dromtrasna has a special link with the celebration of Confirmation in the parish. A few weeks ago the children who are receiving Confirmation this year, took part in what is called The 'Abbeyfeale Initiative'. This is a programme on healthy life choices, run by the Catholic Church for Confirmation students with the help of Transition Year students, who are trained to deliver the programme to the children in sixth class. It has been up and running very successfully in the parish for ten years.

The programme concludes with the annual walk to Killeenagh Holy Well, where the young people from the Confirmation Class make a commitment to abstain from alcohol and drugs during their teenage years. As an acknowledgment of their participation in the programme, the children receive wrist bands which are very popular with them, and the visit to the Well concludes with a barbecue on the Cotter farm

The Remembering Zoë Charity Cycle in association with Abbeyfeale Cycling Club takes place on Sunday May 13th, starting in Abbeyfeale at 9am from Fr. Casey's GAA Club. For safety reasons the Gardai will close the road from the GAA Club and New Street to Buckley's cross on the Athea road from 09.00 to 09.20 approximately. All cyclists will turn left at Buckley's cross and follow the Kilmorna road to Shanacool cross. In the afternoon the Cycle will pass through Main Street, New Street and also the townlands of Ballaugh, Ballybehy and Knockbrack.
