Legion of Mary

On Sunday September 24th an impressively large congregation descended on
Knock Shrine. It manifested the power of the organisation of The Legion of
Mary in this country. The secular media, however, did not give it a mention.
If it was a march against the eight amendment, it would have got a lot of
attention. But most of Legion work is done quietly. We have a branch in this
parish for over sixty years, quietly working away. They visit the sick in our
hospitals and homes every week, e.g. St. Ita's Newcastle and Kilcara Nursing
Home. They keep in touch with Abbeyfeale's people abroad by means of a
regular newsletter and re-union in London. The reunion this year takes place
in the Catholic Club, 2 Dukes Avenue, Chiswick W4 2AE, on Saturday 21st
October. They look after Catholic newspapers and pamphlets in the church.
They are a big support to the Adoration group especially during Lent. Frank
Duff's vision of involving the millions of Laity in the work of the Apostolate
as a kind of spiritual army came to fruition in the Legion of Mary. Its main
limitation is its numbers. We have here in Abbeyfeale a male adult unit. We
would like to hear of people who would have the time and interest to get
involved. Please don't hesitate but do have a word in the ear of any of the
clergy or a Legion member and this should do the trick.

Danaher McGrath Trust

The Danaher McGrath Trust is seeking applications for a scholarship
for third level students. In order to apply for the scholarship students
must meet the following criteria. Applicants must reside in Abbeyfeale,
Athea, Mountcollins, Tournafulla or Templeglantine. The scholarship is
provided on a means test basis and is for students of limited means.
Students who are undertaking courses of study in Irish language, Irish
literature or Irish Music will be given preference in the application
process. Application forms are available at local Secondary Schools in
Abbeyfeale, Newcastle West and Tarbert and upon request from Woulfe
Murphy Solicitors, Abbeyfeale Tel 068-31106. The minimum award
will be €2,000 per annum. The maximum award will be €5,000 per
annum. Students are entitled to apply for the award each year.
No student will be awarded the scholarship for more than 4 years in
duration.
