A key word for Easter is joy. Jesus has said that he came so that we would have joy to the full. It's worth asking what sort of joy this is. The joy of success? The joy of love? The joy of recovery? There are many sorts of joy in our lives: the joy of Jesus at Easter is the lasting joy. After pain, violence, and death he knows now he has overcome it all.

There is no darkness in life which his joy cannot touch. He gives hope in every situation of life: when we feel rejection, in bereavement, in sickness, failure and in death itself. This Easter day we rejoice in the resurrection and the hope it gives us in the darker moments of our lives. In the words of the Easter Exultet sung at the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night,

"The power of this holy night dispels all evil, washes guilt away, restores lost innocence, brings mourners joy; it casts out hatred, brings us peace and humbles earthly pride" (Easter Exultet). May the Joy of this day remain with us for ever.

A Word from Pope Francis

"What was a simple act, done surely out of love – going to the tomb – has now turned into an event, a truly life-changing event. Nothing remains as it was before, not only in the lives of those women, but also in our own lives and in the history of mankind. Jesus is not dead, he has risen, he is alive! He does not simply return to life; rather, he is life itself, because he is the Son of God, the living God. And this is a message meant for me and for you dear sister, for you dear brother. How often does Love have to tell us: Why do you look for the living among the dead? Our daily problems and worries can wrap us up in ourselves, in sadness and bitterness... and that is where death is. That is not the place to look for the One who is alive! Let the risen Jesus enter your life, welcome him as a friend, with trust: he is life! If up till now you have kept him at a distance, step forward. He will receive you with open arms. If you have been indifferent, take a risk: you won't be disappointed. If following him seems difficult, don't be afraid, trust him, be confident that he is close to you, he is with you and he will give you the peace you are looking for and the strength to live as he would have you do".
