We all know something of the story of Jonah, how he got swallowed by a whale, then thrown up on the shore where he was supposed to go in the first place. Jonah heard the voice of God, thought about it, and then decided that since he did not care for those people he'd go in the opposite direction and leave them to their own devices.

I love Jonah. He is so human. He admits his failings and his knowledge that God is a Good and forgiving God. He also knows that he doesn't want to be the channel of peace and forgiveness of God to a people whom he considers to be in need of punishment.

Jonah is a symbol of so many of us. We know God loves everyone. We know God is merciful and Kind. We know we are called to be a channel of God's peace. And yet, despite our religious background, many of us have found ourselves balking at the idea of God being merciful to one or other group with whom we disagree or dislike.

It becomes easy to justify our behaviour, minimize it, so that we do not feel so guilty about not doing what we know in our heart we should do. We permit the secular values to overtake our spiritual core and this is how we "turn our back" on God.

In my formative years I knew God loved everyone but that knowledge did not prevent me from hating those whom I considered the oppressor, or minimizing contact with people of a different faith. In this I was just like Jonah.

Thank God for whales. When we sink so low we need someone who is willing to speak truth to us, who is willing to pick us up, shake us into submission and learn to really trust the God in whom we say we trust.

Creator God, Great Spirit, I give thanks for those who were willing to confront the shallowness of my trust in you. I give thanks for those who, when I had sunk so low in my faith cared enough to point, with love, to my error and direct me where you wished me to be. May the Holy Spirit continue to keep this fire for all alive and let this fire spread as I open my mind and heart to all of creation and be a channel of peace and love. Amen. Fr. Seamus Doyle


Poor Clares Cloister Day
