'Save the Planet - Our Common Home'

In June 2015 Pope Francis published a document (Encyclical) Laudato Si', in which he calls for action at local, national and international levels to combat ecological destruction, and in particular the future threat and current reality of climate change. Speaking in the strongest terms in defence of the environment as "our common home," Pope Francis warns of the unprecedented destruction of ecosystems as a result of human activity, clearly outlining the threats to future generations as a result of our actions.

"This Encyclical is one of the most significant Church documents in a generation. It is a powerful wake-up call to a world sleep-walking into disaster. Pope Francis has clearly aligned the Catholic Church with calls for urgent political action to reduce carbon emissions and set the world on the path to a sustainable future.

The consequences of climate change are evident on a daily basis. Drought, flooding, storms and forced migration are all on the rise. Although we are insulated from the worst impacts in Ireland, we must not forget that hundreds of millions of people around the world are struggling to survive in great part due to the changing climate. Pope Francis said that "We are custodians of this planet and we have a clear moral obligation to ensure that everyone has access to its abundant resources, and that we hand it to future generations in a condition that is compatible with life."
