"Prayer is as important as the air we breathe"

In his Pastoral Letter for Lent, Bishop Brendan Leahy, Bishop of Limerick, emphasises the centrality of prayer for Christians, the Bishop says, "The power of prayer allows us to communicate directly with God, anytime, in a church or anywhere. With the hustle and bustle of family life this can be hard, but there always meal times, the Angelus, or with children before they go to sleep.

Bishop Leahy continues, Prayer is the raising of our mind and heart to God. Prayer is as important as the air we breathe. I once have heard someone say, 'I want to pray but I am too busy and I don't want to miss out on television, movies, going out with friends.' Yes, we should do these things but, as humans, we need to pray, it is good for us. Saint Mother Teresa said: 'I used to believe that prayer changed things, but now I know that prayer changes us, and we change things.

In his Pastoral Letter, Bishop Leahy says, "A simple way to pray is to say "For You" that is, for God, before each action we are doing. We can also pray for our own needs, and the intentions of others. I pray that we use our God-given gifts to make a better world; for a loved one who is ill or distressed; the end of war in Ukraine; young people trying to get housing; disrespect shown to our neighbours who have come here for a new life; those experiencing poverty; and for an end to violence again women, children and random attacks on people. "Let us come home to God this Lent by chatting to Him from the heart, every day." Copies of the Pastoral Letter are available in the church this weekend.

First Anniversary of the Russian invasion of Ukraine. Friday 24 February marked one year since the Russian invasion of Ukraine, Archbishop Eamon Martin said, "Our hearts and prayers continue go out to the suffering people of Ukraine. During Lent let our acts of prayer, charity and fasting, each day, be dedicated to the plight of refugees, and for a global peaceful environment. We must always work for peace, pray for peace and make sacrifices for peace. All of us have the capacity to build peace by our words, our actions and our attitudes to others.'

Garment of Pain

During this Lenten season, the parish invites all parishioner to leave your pain and suffering at the Cross. The Garment of Pain is a simple way of drawing together experiences of pain and suffering of many people, in a way that enables us to support one another in prayer. Over the period of Lent, we invite you to place a piece of material—roughly 6x6—in the baskets provided in the church. The cloth represents whatever your particular pain in life happens to be. During Lent, we will remember the intentions of those who have placed their cloth in the baskets in our Masses. The pieces of cloth will be sown together to form one big patchwork quilt. During the Mass of the Last Supper on Holy Thursday, we will place the cloth on the altar to symbolically unite our suffering with the offering of Christ in the Mass. On Good Friday the cloth will be draped over the cross which is the focus of our prayer that day.

During our Easter Vigil, we will place the Garment of Pain with the Paschal fire to symbolise that the light of Christ is always greater than our suffering and pain.

Trócaire 2023

This year, the focus of the Trócaire Lenten campaign is on Somalia in East Africa and highlights how climate change, drought and conflict are severely affecting families and communities there. Tommy Tiernan, comedian and broadcaster visited Somalia in September 2022, and saw at first hand the work of Trócaire, and the positive impact the organisation was having on the people of Somalia. This is what Tommy Tiernan said on his return to Ireland. "The people of Ireland can be proud of the work that Trócaire is doing in Somalia. Proud of the fact that after the civil war in 1993 when every other humanitarian organisation left Somalia, Trócaire stayed. Stayed and set up hospitals, stayed and set up schools. Stayed to such an extent that the people of western Somalia refer to Trócaire as "our mother". Let the Government of Ireland now do something that we can also be proud of. There will in all probability be more famines to come. And how are we to face these? Well, there are structural weaknesses in the global food supply system. Weaknesses that were highlighted following the 2007-08 food price crisis but these were left unaddressed and we will continue to sleepwalk into catastrophe after catastrophe until they are. The system is broken. Any system that tolerates the starvation of children is a crime against humanity."

Trócaire has been working with our partners in Somalia for 30 years and so is in a unique position to offer support to those affected. Trócaire Boxes are available at the entrance to the church. We encourage you to take one home and to bring one to a neighbour.
