Acts of Kindness Advent

During the season of Advent why not practice some genuine random acts of kindness. Random Acts of Kindness Day – is said to have started back in 1982, when Anne Herbert wrote on a placemat, 'Practise random acts of kindness and senseless acts of beauty.' It was a reversal of another phrase she'd read, 'random acts of violence and senseless acts of cruelty'. There's no doubt which is better, and we know this from experience.

A random act of kindness brightens up someone's day by surprising them with an unexpected act of kind-heartedness. For example during the Christmas shopping why not let someone else go ahead of you at the checkout or pay for a stranger's cup of tea or coffee. Why not help someone with carrying their shopping to the car park, or help carry a pushchair down a flight of steps. An act of kindness can be as simple as holding a door for someone, the list is endless. A kind act means giving and not expecting anything in return. We give in the spirit of the Gospel. Advent is a time when we look into our own hearts and challenge our motivations for what we do. Can we give more of ourselves to God or to someone we love? Perhaps we can offer a 'listening ear' or 'waste time' with people, in the positive sense, who need our company. Can we affirm each other? These are all acts of giving. Putting it simply we need a heart for each other.

Random acts of kindness Tree.

At the start of Advent, we invite parishioners to make a commitment to doing some act of kindness in the lead up to Christmas. We have erected in the sanctuary of the church our Parish Random Act of Kindness Tree. We ask you to write your intended act of kindness on the cards provided and hang it on the tree. In this way we will all draw encouragement from one another, and hopefully be inspired to carry out some act of kindness between now and Christmas. Let us do our bit to make everyone a little happier.

Parish Units

At the diocesan Synod held in April 2016, it was decided by the delegates at the Synod to introduce a model of Team Ministry throughout the diocese. This weekend Bishop Leahy has issued a pastoral letter on this new approach to ministering in the diocese. Parishes will be working in Units and the list of Units was published last week. Abbeyfeale will be part of a Unit that includes the parishes of Templeglantine, Athea and Tournafulla-Mountcollins parishes. From the 1st of December 2018, all priests working in the Unit are Co-Parish Priests of all of the parishes in the Unit. Fr Denis Mullane has been appointed as Moderator of the Unit of Parishes. Fr Mullane's role will be to coordinate the pastoral work in the Unit of Parishes. In the new year a single Pastoral Council will be put in place for the Unit of Parishes. Each individual parish within the Unit will have a co-ordinating committee or local parish council. This new structure will see greater movement of the priests within the Unit of Parishes, especially for the celebration of the Vigil Mass and Sunday Mass. We ask you to take home a copy of Bishop Leahy's Pastoral Letter. Over the coming weeks we will have more details in the weekly Newsletter.
