First Friday Reflections with Fr Shoji

On the First Friday of each month, beginning next Friday 5th of July,

Fr Shoji will lead an hour of Praise and Worship in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel beginning at 9.00am. He will lead parishioners in reflecting on the Word of God and will conclude with the Rosary. All parishioners are welcome, especially parents and children. Fr Shoji says that 'A visit to the Blessed Sacrament is a great treasure of the Catholic faith. It nourishes neighbourliness and community and gives us opportunities for adoration and thanksgiving, for reparation and supplication.

We read in St. Mathews gospel 22: 37 "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind". When the apostles adored the Lord in prison, the chains fell off their wrists'. Dear friends, Jesus asks us, "Could you not keep watch with me for one hour?" We can say to our Lord "Yes, Lord, here I will spend time with you. So let us worship and adore Him and be blessed through this Holy Hour. Fr Shoji is also encouraging our children to attend Mass regularly, especially on Sundays during the summer holidays.

Young Pioneers

This past week 25 children from this year's Confirmation class were enrolled as members of the Pioneer Association. Young Pioneers are aged 12 years and over. They undertake to abstain from alcoholic drink until at least 18 and keep off illicit drugs for life. The emblem worn by Young Pioneers features the Heart of Christ in gold on a background of red and violet. The red symbolises the fire of the Holy Spirit and the Blood of Christ. Violet in the liturgical colour of self-sacrifice, a central aspect of Christian life.
