Lay led Liturgies

This week in all of the 60 parishes of the diocese including the parish of Abbeyfeale, Lay led public prayers were led entirely by lay people. As Bishop Leahy said "This is a step that we know we have to start moving into. It's a first step and a small step; it's not going to happen every week. It's a first step to training for the future." "Lay led prayers will not be an 'alternative' or 'mini' Mass, but instead, a moment of public prayer, that is thoroughly valued in its own right". These lay led public prayer services will be celebrated as the need arises into the future. Sincere thanks to all who assisted and led the Liturgy of the Word prayer service on Tuesday morning.

Youth Ministry Training Programme

Following up on the Core Strategic Actions named at the Diocesan Synod last vear and outlined in our Diocesan Pastoral Plan the Youth Ministry Team in the Diocese will be delivering a Youth Ministry Training Programme beginning in September 2017. The ultimate aim of the programme will be to train people from Parishes/Pastoral Areas to deliver youth ministry in their own localities. Our goal is to empower and encourage people at local level to take on leadership roles in the area of youth ministry and so the training will be very much focused on the practical elements and will offer resources and tips as well as the looking at the theory and theology. Having spent over 10 years in youth ministry we know the importance of team work and support and so we are insisting that parishes would gather teams of 4 people to participate. Details of cost, venues, dates etc are yet to be confirmed but at the moment we are looking at a 12 week course running one night a week from September to December and including one or two Saturdays. We are currently liaising with the Institute for Pastoral Studies, Mary Immaculate College and the Redemptorists who have run youth ministry training for the last 20 years.
