Living with Covid-19 Plan - Level 3

As you are aware the country has now moved to Level 3 of the 'National Framework for living with Covi-19 Plan'. This means that the public celebration of Mass – except for weddings and funerals - is suspended for the duration of this restriction. The maximum number of people that can attend a funeral in Level 3 is 25. The maximum number of people allowed to attend a wedding is 25. Baptisms are to be deferred during this period. The celebration of Masse will continue online during this period, except for the 11.00am Saturday morning Mass. All Mass intentions that are booked to be celebrated over the next three weeks will be offered as planned. Parishioners can link in online through the Church Services TV Network and the 10.00am Sunday morning Mass will continue to be broadcast on West Limerick 102FM. The second closure of our churches during this pandemic is a huge disappointment to all of us. We all need to redouble our efforts in Social distancing, washing our hands and maintaining good cough etiquette. We entrust the situation to Our Lady of the Rosary.

Next weekend, on *World Mission Sunday*, Mass collections in over 120 countries will be offered to support the life-giving work of overseas missionaries.
