The Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord Thursday 25th March

The Feast of the Annunciation is the reason why we celebrate Christmas on December 25. Christmas comes exactly nine months after the Archangel Gabriel invited the Virgin Mary to be the Mother of God, an event we commemorate on March 25.

What does Mary's "Yes" say to us? The encounter between Mary and the Angel opens up the meaning of our own lives, by shedding light on our call to participate in God's loving plan. Mary, in her selflessness, was open to the angel's visit. She recognised who was speaking. She listened, received and responded. In so doing, she shows us the way to respond to the Lord's call in our own lives.

God initiates a relationship with each one of us - and we respond in surrendering freely to him by accepting Jesus Christ as Saviour and Lord. Not just once, but daily. This dynamic, our free response to the Lord's invitations, leads to a dialogue, a conversation, a way of life.

We are continually reminded of the importance of this feast to our salvation in various devotional prayers. Two examples that highlight the importance of this feast are the Angelus and the Joyous Mysteries of the Rosary.
