

Mission Sunday

This weekend we celebrate the missionary work of the Church. The theme for this year's celebration of Mission Sunday is: "Hearts on Fire, Feet on the Move" (Luke 24: 13-35). In Ireland, Missio Ireland is responsible for coordinating World Mission Sunday. They are part of a global network serving the Church in over 120 countries. They seek to help the faithful to understand and respond to the call of mission. They respect all cultures and traditions by treating everyone as brothers and sisters under one loving God. Missio Ireland thanks you for your financial support and prayers. All offerings and donations made for World Mission Sunday become part of the Holy Father's Universal Solidarity Fund. This fund is a lifeline for struggling missionaries and the communities they serve across Africa, Asia and Latin America, where over 1,100 mission dioceses are found. As these dioceses form and grow, so do their needs. On top of this, mission dioceses are often in remote areas devastated by war and natural disasters, or where suppressed communities are just opening up to the life-saving message of Jesus Christ.

Donations for Mission Sunday will be collected at all Masses this weekend. There is a special envelope in our parish box of envelopes. If you don't use the parish envelope system, there are envelopes available at the entrance to the church. If you wish to support the missions simply put your donation into the envelope and put the envelope into the basket during the offertory collection. Thank you for supporting in whatever way you can the work of our missionaries. Remember it is more than an appeal for financial help. Missionaries also need spiritual support. Our missionaries take great strength in knowing that the faithful of the world are keeping them in their thoughts and prayers.

Charitable Donation Scheme

At this time of year many parishioners who participate in the Tax Rebate Scheme are receiving a new Enduring Certificate CHY3 for signing, which will be valid for five years. Parishioners who contribute a minimum of €250 to the parish in a year and who pay tax can participate at no extra cost and the parish will benefit.
