Exploring Eucharist.

We continue to reflect on phrases from the Mass. This week we reflect on 'Lord hear us. - Lord graciously hear us'

We don't say 'Hear me, hear my prayer' but 'Lord hear us, Lord graciously hear us. Does prayer carry more power when plural?

'If two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven' (Matthew 18:19). In Jesus' eyes, there is something special about the prayers we make together.

The 'Prayer of the Faithful' is just that. It takes us beyond personal needs and wants; it is more than the preference of any individual. It articulates the prayer of all of us together for ourselves, for other members of the body of Christ, for all who share a common humanity.

And when we say 'Lord hear us' it's not as if God might not be listening. (it might well be about increasing our awareness and desire). When we ask the Lord to hear us, when we pray with one heart, as one body, the Spirit 'hears our prayer into the heart of God. (From Exploring Eucharist by Donal Harrington)
