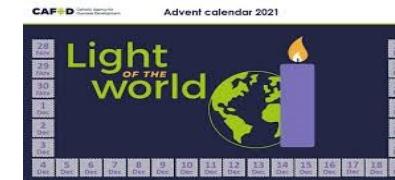

**Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> December**

Wednesday next is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. Mary is declared by the Angel Gabriel to be "full of grace", conceived without the stain of sin, and whom generations will call blessed. Vigil Mass for the feast day on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> at 7.00pm. Mass on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> at 10.00am and at 7.00pm.

**Advent Wreath Lighting of the Bethlehem Candle**

On the second Sunday of Advent, the second purple candle is lit. This candle typically represents love. Some traditions call this the "Bethlehem Candle," symbolizing Christ's manger: "This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." (Luke 2:12, NIV)



**Prayer for the Second Sunday of Advent.**

Christmas is coming! Are you prepared? Are you ready? Are you counting down? Christ is coming! As we prepare for our Christmas celebrations we light the second candle of our Advent wreath, as a sign that we are prepared to be the light of Christ, bringing his healing presence to a needy world.

**Prayer:** Light the second candle and pray - *Lord of all, remind us of the things that are truly important. Come to this world, come to us, come to all people and bring the joy and justice that few expect but all need. Amen. (Say 1 Our Father and 3 Hail Mary's and pray for all who need healing in their lives at this time)*

**The Jesse Tree**

Many of you will be familiar with the TV programme "Who do you think you are?" This is a programme where celebrities trace their family tree. In the programme the celebrities discover lost connections and unfamiliar histories are revealed. They discover stories of courage, joy, sacrifice and resilience. As they say everyone has a tale to tell. During the season of Advent Christians go on a similar journey through the scriptures - we go back in time, we go back to our roots, our family tree and we learn how the people of the Old Testament lived and struggled in their relationship with God and how they looked forward in hope for the coming of the Messiah. To help us in our family tree journey, we have placed a Jesse Tree in the sanctuary of the church.

The Jesse Tree was named after the Biblical figure Jesse, and the tree is a reference to the passage from Isaiah 11:1, "A shoot shall come out of the stock of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots." Jesse is known to be one of the ancestors of Jesus. We know from the genealogy of Jesus that he was the father of King David. The Jesse tree is decorated with illustrated ornaments that represent the people, and prophecies of the Old Testament. They remind us of events leading up to the birth of Jesus. Using these stories, we trace the story of Jesus and his ancestors from the first day of creation to the birth of Jesus.
